The grant is to help pay rent to Coldside Parish Church for the use of the hall and kitchen.

It is £30 per hour for three hours, Once a week. (£90)

To allow us to hold a Recovery Café there on a weekly basis. For 43 weeks of the year.

Helping address addiction by keeping people in recovery and helping them to move forward with their lives learning new skills and adding to their CV, working towards employment.

The R and R was established in 2014, it is a community café, run by people in recovery of addictions. It is a safe place for all walks of life from the elderly to the youngest. People who are in recovery can access this knowing that it is a safe place for them to come and spend some time, making friends, learning activities, have a sense of belonging, help others by passing on their. It also removes fear of addiction from the community, in particular the elderly.

The food prices are kept to a minimum, this helps with the current living crisis whilst encouraging those who attend to pay their way.

It gives opportunities to people in recovery or those who have been affected by a loved one's addiction to volunteer, learn new skills (serving, food rotation, cleanliness, Fridge/freezer temps, taking orders, handling money and achieve a food hygiene certificate.

We have recently offered a Smart Recovery group to run before the café opens, offering tools and skills to stay in recovery.

Everyone is accepted for themselves and we hold zero stigma in the café.

We have a well-being nurse once a month and benefit advice from Voiceability, on a weekly basis.

We have applied for food share and am awaiting on word back.

We have just purchased a karaoke machine to allow people to have a sing-song which may lead to having a 'modern choir' This was bought after requested by the customers of the R and R. It will lift spirits, provide motivation and give people something to build upon.

We have also agreed to have a employee from a new project called, 'Giving Back, (for community success)' based initially in Broughty Ferry, they will come to us and offer advice on a number of things including, mental health, finances, loneliness, stress and offer signposting in a number of area's. They will work independently for the benefit of the customers of the café and the community surrounding us in the same way as the NHS nurses work.

Now have a 'PAY FORWARD' in place. Where people could leave a donation to help pay for someone's food if they were struggling. It's an obvious way of helping people out but it also allows people to 'give back'.

Established in 2014, comments from customers on what they like and how they enjoy the café are on-going. We have just completed our first year back since covid and although slow is now starting to take off once more.

What evidence do you hold that the local community supports this application?

As above, initially was a project started by ADP but was taken over by Crossreach when other services stopped sending in an employee.

We work closely with the customers and ask what they would like to see in the café. We also provide a complaints and compliments book and encourage customers to write in the book with their comments on how we run the café.

We have been told:

- I enjoy the community based friendly atmosphere, what it promotes and generates, It's a safe place to come and to connect and eat and drink. What it provides in my humble opinion, is priceless.

- I find the R and R to be an excellent focal point for me to meet my clients, it is welcoming and informal allowing cliets to be open and receive the support they require. Voicability.

We have started running a 'pay forward' scheme, where people can buy a cup of tea or coffee / a meal for someone who is struggling. We signpost to other organisations which can help people with food & clothing and toys for children and will continue to signpost to any other service that we know about which can provide help in other area's. We have advice about benefits each week in situ.
