We are looking for funding to provide activities and supplies to run the fortnightly Barnhill Blethers sessions that have been really popular with the local community. A evaluation was recently carried out where participants that took part in focus groups highlighted the importance and positive impact of the group, but also had a chance to take part in consultation on what they would like to see going forward. The activity ideas presented in this application for the rest of the financial year is based on this.

This project has been a great success so far with local partners such as police etc dropping in or being recommended as a place to refer people locally.

Which City Plan / Local Community Plan Outcome(s) will it address?

We need to take action on the cost of living

Although this application will start in mid summer, people will still be feel the effects of paying energy bills and putting more away in the summer months to try to help with the bills ahead next winter. Activities like these that are free of charge help people socialise and grab a coffee and a chat with friends at no cost, as well as providing a space for energy/money advice services that can offer support during these difficult times.

## We need opportunities to get involved in community life in The Ferry

People have fed back that they are unaware of services/activities in the area. By asking a number of services to come along, the community should feel better connected and having a space means that there is somewhere to go to find out what is on offer, as not everyone is online. We are looking to develop a small folder/information directory so people can look through it to see what services are on offer based on the subject i.e. welfare support or health etc.

# We need a community facility in The Ferry

As there is no council building/community centre, we have to be creative and make use of the space available in the ward/sub areas to provide the needed services/activities.

We need to improve life chances for children and families — we are linking with the school and family development workers to encourage parents to attend/what we can put on for them to attend. We have also been in touch with Pupil Support workers at Grove and had some young people come along to get involved in the project to start looking at intergenerational links/providing young people with skills such as helping with the setting up, tea and coffee to give them some skills and confidence that can transfer to them getting more involved in their local community/employability skills.

Pre covid it was identified that a café/facility was needed in this part of the ward due to high levels of social isolation. This has increased significantly due to the pandemic, it is also a free place to access a Beveridge and an activity so there is no cost to the participant which is also important during

We recently conducted an evaluation/consultation to find out what people thought of the delivery so far and what they would like to see in future They advised that the project has:

Opportunity to meet people and have a nice chat. Something to look forward to. Like the idea of having to speak to somebody. It brings me out of the house. It is a friendly group. Makes you feel welcome. The staff are nice (3)

"I do miss coming here now". Nice having a casual meeting.

Yes good to get out of the house and have a Blether

They also felt they knew more about various services that could help them and some have had follow up involvement with certain services i.e. after a meeting with SCARF, as few attendees also got home visits to help with energy efficiency that will ultimately help with energy costs.
