Fintry and friends out of school care (ffoosc) would like to take children on trips throughout the holidays. This gives children a chance to be away from the school setting where ffoosc are based, to have new experiences and adventures with friends. The trip to Camperdown Zoo and Park will be a full day trip leaving Fintry at 10am and arriving back around 4.30.

Trips can extend children's learning, boost their development, and expand their world. All these benefits to the children promote awareness of others, encourages their curiosity, and supports holistic development.

Ffoosc plan a programme of activities with the children, including trips and try to incorporate their ideas into the plans. Some children would love trips to London, to the swimming, to Spain or even to Alton towers. Unfortunately ffoosc are unable to do any of these but we do endeavour to have the children out and about as much as possible.

A trip to Camperdown Zoo and Park promotes language skills, social skills, inquisitiveness, curiosity, physical and mental wellbeing and builds bonds between the children supporting old and new friendships. Learning about the world around them is essential for children to process their feelings and thoughts. The natural world, being outdoors in open spaces, view animals in the habitats etc is known to be supportive to metal and physical health.

The children who attend ffoosc do not always get the chance to be away from home. Parent/cares are working, and some are in working poverty. Ffoosc also support vulnerable children throughout the holidays and these children would

benefit greatly from trips. The trips are extremely important to give all the children a change of environment and the chance to be with peers experiencing new adventures. The summer holidays are a long 6 weeks for some children and being able to break these up with trips is something ffoosc try to do. The financial impact of summer and trips on ffoosc means we are unable to provide these without funding. The parent committee have organised a sponsored cycle and scoot for the children to take part in a to help with the costs of the summer holidays. They are also organising a fundraiser evening to take place in August for resources.

A lottery grant has also been applied for to support holidays for the coming year. Trips are an important part of the children's growth and development both physically and mentally promoting their awareness of the world around them. Building confidence, building resilience, and giving the children opportunities to experience new things all supports their future selves. Trips benefit children with learning through direct interaction, learning to adapt to the new environment, even if its just a new park with different types of equipment to use. Adapting, building resilience supports children to reach their potential, now and in the future.

What local consultation has taken place regarding this application? The children are fully involved in the planning of summer activities through circle times, discussions, and their interests. Ffoosc also support vulnerable children throughout the summer and work with school, family support and development worker to highlight children who would benefit from this.

What evidence do you hold that the local community supports this application? Ffoosc has a parent led committee with parents from the local community who oversee and work in conjunction with senior staff.

Ffoosc staff manage Fintry Community Playgroup and work in the 5-9's children group. These are both based in the local community and children from 5-9's will attend ffoosc for a joined-up provision.

Ffooscs parents are working/studying/training parents/carers which is why they use ffoosc. Some parents will use it for social time for their children also. Children who attend through a support place are seen as vulnerable due to family circumstances such as substance abuse, mental health issues, poverty and/or financial restraints limiting family activities etc Building connections across the local community, building trust and positive relationships with children and families benefits the community as a whole.

Many of ffoosc parents are on the poverty line and use foodbanks or take regular food bags from ffoosc to help their money go a bit further.

Many children will not have any time away from home this summer due to financial restraints on the family. Being able to support these children and families is an important aspect of ffoosc's aims.

Giving the children time away, new experiences, learning through play and meeting new people is essential for children to grow, developed and gain new knowledge and understanding about the world around them.
