Since our open day held at the park last year, our volunteer numbers have doubled.

We now have a more diverse range of skills and knowledge which we intend to use while aiming to improve the park for our visitors.

We need to prepare areas for the introduction of wildflowers and tree planting which requires more specialist tools currently provided by Volunteers.

There is also a backlog of path clearance due to the extent of recent storms causing fallen branches and small trees.

In the future the group will hold a range of tools to carry out more projects with serviceable equipment.

Some of the tools we request will make our jobs easier and will mitigate some Health and Safety issues. i.e. Manual handling, and provision of adequate Person Protection Equipment for the task in hand. On the admin side of things, the group hope to produce a management plan for the park which will be paper and ink hungry in its production.

All visitors to Clatto Country Park will benefit as will Dundee City Council as work carried out by volunteers around the park is free and can be enjoyed by all.

Friends of Clatto volunteers work to ensure the park is safe for all visitors and ongoing maintenance is necessary to ensure this is the case.

This year we are making improvements to the biodiversity of the park by introducing wildflower areas and tree planting to encourage wildlife to prosper.

More specialist tools were required to carry this out.

We also need Perspex to maintain our noticeboards and paint to service the park furniture procured in previous C.R.F capital grant awards.

We also aim to provide temporary wildlife information boards around the park to inform visitors.

Also, there is a cost to administer the group which requires stationery and other sundries, our main cost being the procurement of yearly Public Liability Insurance.

Some of the admin costs are presently being paid from group member's own pocket's which is not ideal.

Our needs were discussed amongst Committee members at recent meetings.

Consultation with Dundee Countryside Rangers has given us permission to develop new biodiverse areas around the park. There have been no objections to us carrying out this task and this benefits the local wildlife and birdlife in the park. Information is often shared on our Friends of Clatto Facebook page from people that have visited the park and stated that they have noticed improvements that we have carried out that have made their park experience more positive.

All visitors, whether able bodied or disabled are included in our plans to improve and restore areas of the park so access is for all, and good mental health and physical wellbeing can be practiced in a beautiful outdoor setting.
