To cover the expenses of designing, publishing, and distributing three print runs of 5,000 newsletters (a total of 15,000) in 2026/27, which will focus on the areas of greatest need in Stobswell, we seek funding.

The newsletters will be distributed throughout the year on June 26, November 26, and March 27. They will highlight the work of the Dundee City Council, local third sector organisations, the Stobswell Forum, and other organisations collaborating across the Maryfield ward.

Examples of articles published in the newsletters over the past year include the regeneration of Albert Street and the District Shopping Centre, the request to reduce the number of HGVs and Intercity buses using Albert Street, support for Boomerang Stobswell and Dundee International Womens Centre, Dundee Women's Aid, and promotion of the launch of the Dolly Parton Imagination Library.

Additionally, the newsletters will include articles showcasing local public art and providing guidance on how to report graffiti and fly tipping to the council.

The newsletters will also cover a diverse range of topics, such as civic inclusion, the activities of the Dundee City Council Private Sector and Housing Department, promotion of the Stobswell Festive Celebration and Appeal, Highlighting the work of the Local Fairness Initiative and the Stobswell/Trinity Parish Church.

The primary objective of the newsletter is to encourage residents to become more involved in local issues and provide feedback on matters such as 20 MPH zones and community festivals. Furthermore, the newsletter aims to foster community cohesion and reduce isolation within central Stobswell.

Enhance the Empowerment of Local Communities

Enhance the empowerment of local communities by fostering the development of more cohesive and less isolated communities. This can be achieved by promoting services that are accessible within the area and provide support to young people and individuals struggling with substance misuse.

Additionally, campaign for the creation of more green spaces and highlight the potential for regeneration within the District Shopping Centre.

How many people will benefit from this project?

The entire community will benefit from this initiative. Each print run will distribute 5,000 copies of the newsletter throughout central Stobswell. Additionally, the newsletter will be promoted through the Forum's website, social media channels and a weekly email which reaches 400 local residents

Our community has continued to be under severe pressure with successive huge impacts including BREXIT, the COVID pandemic and the ongoing Cost of Living Crisis which hasn't lessened with increasing numbers of local people facing daily challenges in accessing support to provide the very basics for a decent standard of living.

The Stobswell Voice will continue to highlight the many opportunities to be supported within the community and help people gain help where its needed

As the recognised Neighbourhood Representative Structure for the area Stobswell Forum SCIO are regularly asked to address issues on behalf of local people. A newsletter provides a great way of getting both information out and gaining feedback to support the community, build networks and campaign for maintaining and improving services. The Stobswell Voice newsletter is particularly important to those living in our community who have limited or no access to social media or the internet, these local residents can be isolated and feel cut off from the community they live in.

The Stobswell Voice is an important part of improving community cohesion and gives a voice to some of the remarkable and positive work that goes on in the community which often goes under the radar but which can point to positive change not only being possible but deliverable

What local consultation has taken place regarding this application?

We have previously conducted an online consultation with very positive results and plan to look for other ways to receive feedback over the coming year,

We have also discussed the application with the DCC Empowerment Team, local councillors and agencies working in the area who perceived the Stobswell Voice as a vehicle for positive change.

The Forum primarily use Facebook and X to keep lines of communication open with the wider community the hard copy newsletter is seen as an important part of community cohesion and inclusion.

Groups and agencies working in the area agree that they would like to get information out to local people living in Maryfield,

In all of our conversations there is feedback confirming the need to take into account people who find it difficult to access online resources

We have undertaken an online consultation which is very supportive of the Stobswell Voice Newsletter

We have received numerous positive comments from local residents commending the Stobswell Voice's previous editions and encouraging the Stobswell Forum to continue producing the newsletter. Furthermore, we believe that the newsletter is now more essential than ever, as the spectre of increased deprivation is affecting more local people each year.

Direct communication with local residents is paramount in this context.

The newsletter specifically targets central Stobswell, where the Scottish Government Index of Multiple Deprivation indicates a higher concentration of individuals in need of support. Additionally, it is distributed to areas of the ward with a higher density of older residents who may not have the same level of access to digital information.
