Overview

We are applying for funding to support a free, family fun event at Ormiston Lounge. This initiative is a direct response to community feedback and the need for accessible, family-friendly activities in the North East of Dundee during the summer holidays.

This provision is in line with the needs identified in the North East Community Plan : North East has a higher percentage of Children living in poverty (36%) compared to Dundee average (31%). – SIMD 2020

Purpose and Community Need

During recent consultation around Ormiston Play Park, families in the Ormiston area have expressed a need for local, no-cost events that offer safe, engaging opportunities. This event aims to reduce social isolation, promote wellbeing, and strengthen community connections, particularly for those facing financial hardship during the school break.

Use of Funds

The grant will be used to cover the following:

- **Activity Resources:** Prizes for bingo and games (AHA will provide)
- **Entertainment:** A magician and the cost of a professional face painter
- **Refreshments:** snacks and drinks for attendees (AHA will provide half the funding towards this)
- **Staff Time:** Planning, coordination, and delivery of the event by Tenant Engagement staff
- **Promotion:** Design and distribution of flyers, posters, and digital promotion to ensure wide community reach
- **Support Services:** We will promote this on social media for community participation and local agencies to support the event.

In-Kind Contributions

Angus Housing Association will provide:

- Free use of the Ormiston Community Lounge,
- A contribution of £50 towards refreshments
- Prizes for games and bingo
- A range of games and activities from existing resources, including prize bingo, traditional games such as musical bumps and arts and crafts

Due to the impact of the increase of the cost of living crisis, there is a need for free provision for local families to participate in opportunities that will reduce social isolation and enhance access to services.
In terms of deprivation, the North East has a higher percentage of children living in poverty (36%) compared to the Dundee average of 31% (SIMD 2020)
As a social housing landlord, Angus Housing Association is aware of and has discussed the impact of rising costs in fuel, food, and general living expenses with tenants. Free, local family events help tackle deprivation by reducing social isolation, offering positive experiences, and connecting families to support services. Our event will include signposting to provide advice and information, ensuring families can access the help they need in a welcoming setting.

We recently carried out a consultation in the Ormiston area in May 2025 regarding Ormiston play park and upon conversation, tenants commented on an interest in activities in the play park and suggested gala type activities. Although this will take place in the Lounge, this meets criteria of free family activities in the area.
