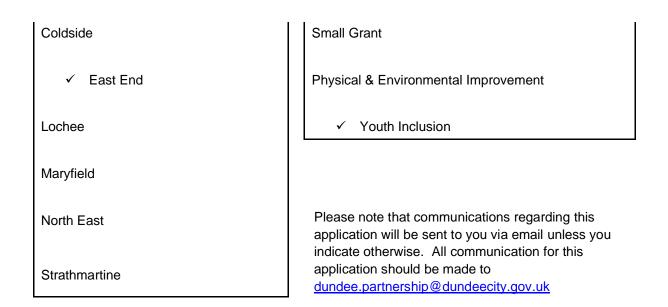

The East Youth Team (EYT) would like to continue to provide youth provisions for local young people in Midcraigie and Linlathen. We are currently running provisions out of Rowantree PS three evenings per week. These include a P7 Drop-in, S1-6 Drop-in and Football Drop-in. Over the past four years the EYT has been able to increase the diversionary programmes in the area and respond to the needs and interests of the local young people. Across the three provisions we can see over 100 young people accessing our groups per week.

The funding grant would allow us to continue to run the three diversionary drop-ins per week. Thus, providing young people with a safe space to engage in leisure activities, socialise with friends and peers, build positive connections with youth work staff and access support if needed.

Monies would be used for replenishing and purchasing new resources identified by participants to enable successful engagement and delivery. A successful application

would allow our holiday programmes to continue. Young people are getting opportunities and experiences to take part in free trips and activities that would not be financially feasible for some young people living in this area.

This funding would support the EYT to provide hot meals and snacks to all young people accessing provisions. In the current financial climate, a lot of families are struggling with the cost of living, therefore it is important that we can offer 'tea' out to those who need it.

A greater variety of opportunities that meet the needs and aspirations of our young people will be available so that they are encouraged to stay in the area after leaving school and/or university or college.

The provisions are targeted at young people Primary 7 - S6 (10-18 years), predominantly living in the MidCraigie and Linlathen area. Our data shows that 242 unique participants accessed our provisions from April 2024 to present.

As part of the EYT our work is targeted at young people living in high areas of deprivation. The SIMD 2020 briefing has highlighted the statistics for the child population (aged 0-15) in the most deprived areas with 92.5 % (SIMD 5%) identified in Linlathen and 79.1% (SIMD 5%) identified in Mid Craigie.

With such stark statistics, it is important to have a wider community approach to tackling the inequalities faced by families and young people living in this area. As part of the Linlathen Fairness Initiative I am able to consult with local partners to see what themes are being raised, and through the narrative inquiry the findings showed that there is a need for more spaces/activities for children and young people.

The growth in numbers at our drop-ins show that young people are engaging well with the provisions on offer. The youth team provide a safe space for young people to meet peers, discuss and address some of the inequalities they face whilst building up good supportive relationships.

The provisions offer young people the opportunity to take part in a range of diversionary activities/programmes in turn encouraging positive and informed choices, reducing antisocial and offending behaviours and increasing wellbeing. Young people will be encouraged to get involved in the planning of our activities and programmes.

Providing volunteer opportunities gives young people a chance to develop new skills, build their confidence and enhance their employability.

The EYT ensure that we have a needs led approach and will do continual consultations with young people throughout the year to ensure we are providing what they want in terms of food, resources, activities and trips.

What evidence do you hold that the local community supports this application? (For example, was it proposed by members of a particular group? Does it directly address need identified by community members?)

The application is for the benefit of local young people who are living in Midcraigie and Linlathen.

The EYT works in partnership with Rowantree PS staff who have shared that the provisions positively impact the community and families they work with.

Positive feedback and thanks from parents and carers of young people accessing our provisions is evident of their support for the application.

The numbers attending our groups have increased over the past year, showing that local young people not only support this application but enjoy and need these provisions we provide.

How will the project / activity tackle deprivation or benefit those experiencing deprivation? (Refer to Section 1 of the Guidance Notes)

The SIMD2020 briefing has highlighted the East End Ward as having one of the highest rates of children and young people living within deprivation. There are 5 data zones within the East End that are ranked within 5% most deprived and 2 datazones within the 15% most deprived.

Linlathen (92.6%), and Mid Craigie (79.7%) are the community areas that have the greatest proportions of their populations living in data zones ranked in the 20% most deprived.

The EYT aim to provide free, accessible youth provisions on Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday evenings for local young people. We will consult and encourage young people to design the programme/activities to ensure the needs of the young people are being met and that they are getting the most out of their experience. We hope to create a safe and fun environment where young people can engage with peers, get support from staff and flourish in a positive environment. The free provision will run throughout the year over three evenings (Tuesday, Wednesday & Thursday except for the 2 week Christmas break). It will offer holiday provisions, full of free activities and trips, giving young people the opportunity to try new things and make great memories. Thus, reducing the financial burden on families (especially through the long summer holiday period).

All young people will be offered food at our evening provisions, tacking food insecurity and reducing the stigma of food poverty.

Running the provisions also allows the youth team to identify young people who would benefit from additional support. We can put things in place or signpost where needed.

The EYT are building up positive relationships with young people and offering a service to all young people bridging the gap in societal inequalities.
