To provide salary costs for two children's workers to continue providing twice weekly children's club sessions where children from P1-4 & P1-6 attend free, fun and activity-based sessions after school.

To provide salary costs for music tutor to allow the existing free keyboard & guitar classes for young people to continue.

To purchase resources and refreshments for the clubs.

To provide entertainment and refreshments at children's parties at Halloween and Christmas.

To provide a summer programme for families to spend time together taking part in organised activities at the centre and go on a day trip together.

Please say why the project is needed (please limit your answer to 500 words or less) Local people are looking for things to do for their children in the local area and also with their children during school holidays when they have a lot of time to spend together and not enough spare cash to spend on activities for the duration of the long summer break. The children's work provides a safe space for children from the 2 local schools to attend in a fun and educational setting where they meet other children and develop positive relationships with peers and adults.

The music sessions have been operating since last year and has allowed younger children the opportunity to learn a musical instrument at no cost to their parents. Parents have shared that the cost of sending their children to a music tutor would not be affordable for them. There is extremely limited music tuition offered at primary school and this opportunity allows them to develop an interest and skill that can see them continue in higher education and possibly as a career.

Children are benefitting from the interactive aspects of children's clubs and music tuition that is helping their personal development. One music student performed at the centre's Christmas grotto as a result of increased confidence.

Ongoing rising costs of basic household items are continuing to challenge families and they are appreciative of the opportunities offered to them by the community centre as they can meet other families and do things they may not be able to afford if funding was not available to the centre.

What local consultation has taken place regarding this application?

The LMG discuss activities and programmes at monthly meetings and share what they have been told by parents and other family members about the need for their children to have the opportunity to try new things in their community. Parents have shared details of costs for other groups and activities that prevent them from taking their children along but they can send their children to the centre as their programme is free or very low cost.

Parents have shared that they have purchased musical instruments for their children as they wanted to practice their new skills at home.

What evidence do you hold that the local community supports this application?

Parents/carers share thoughts with LMG volunteers and community workers. LMG discuss issues in their community at monthly meetings.

SFDW and OPFS worker have referred families to attend the activities at the centre and have shared information that they have children and families that would benefit from the range of opportunities continuing in the community centre.

Cost of living is still affecting households and limiting their access to cash for things that are not deemed essential. The community centre is open for all in the community and many that use the services on a regular basis are from households that would not be able to afford to access to similar activities elsewhere due to costs.
