To buy resources for our Youth Diversionary groups that run 4 days a week in the Central area. The groups that will benefit from the resources purchased will be Monday – Girls Group, Tuesday – P7 afterschools club and evening boys group, Wednesday – Youth Drop In, Thursday – St Martin's P7 group. Resources will also be used to support small targeted group work in St Peter & Pauls, Our Lady's and Rosebank primary schools alongside any 1-1 support we give to young people throughout the year.

We are looking to purchase arts & crafts materials to cover all groups including resources for holidays throughout the year. For example, Christmas, Easter, Mother's Day & Father's Day. This gives the young people an opportunity to create, handmade personal gifts to those in their families where money may be limited.

We are looking to purchase new sports equipment to replace lost or damaged pieces that have been used over a long period of time. At each evening provision, the use of the gym hall encourages young people to exercise in fun, free programmes. We are lucky enough to be supported by Leisure & Culture

staff on a Wednesday but they do not provide equipment and we are currently using unsuitable resources to play rounders and dodgeball etc.			
The table tennis is very popular and due to this bats and balls are now showing wear and tear, we would replace bats and balls for the young people to use.			

Which City Plan / Local Community Plan Outcome(s) will it address?

It will provide opportunities for YP participation in diversionary and transitional activities in an area of recognised poverty (SIMD) - caring for the YP attending groups in Coldside by reducing some of the known barriers to participation for YP and their families, many of whom will be hit by the cost of living crisis, by making the activity available free to attend and making a provision of food or vouchers that include food for participants where possible.

COLDSIDE PLAN- We need to respond to the cost of living crisis by developing Partnership actions to mitigate the cost of living for residents in Coldside.

The arts and crafts resources will be used to provide Diversionary and transitional activity opportunities for YP in the evening and with targeted school support. The vouchers are to reduce barriers to participation in fun, recreational activities for families of YP in terms of cost to attend and food provision for participants, in response to cost of living crisis.
We have seen an increase in young people attending our provision due to the introduction & promotion of specific P7 transition groups, this has supported us to increase the number of young people able to attend our provision throughout the year.
With rising levels of mental health/wellbeing issues in young people, we feel this is a much needed resource to offer those in our community who may be struggling to afford activities out with necessary living costs, especially around the festive period.
We would like to offer our young people vouchers for the above places to enable them to attend these provisions which financially they may not be able to afford like their peers.
What local consultation has taken place regarding this application?

Due to the short time to apply for the funding, we have not taking place local consultation but have submitted vouchers based on feedback from young people who have received similar before and fed back how appreciated the parents/carer have been to receive them.

What evidence do you hold that the local community supports this application?

We have verbal discussions with young people about how difficult the festive/holiday period is and how activities such as these are the first thing to go when family budgets are stretched.

We have based this application on these conversations that happen throughout of diversionary work.

It will reduce barriers to participation by all our evening diversionary activities being free and being able to offer art activities for event such as mothers day/fathers day for young people who may not be able to afford a gift for their parents/carers.
