DCSG obtained 3 years funding from the Lottery to employ a development officer and run activities and services for local people in Douglas community Park. The park includes an area run by Douglas Growers, who provide raised beds for people to grow their own produce and provide for the local food larder. Part of the lottery budget included an allowance for utilities (water and electricity

The lottery funding finished in May 25. DCSG is currently applying for grant funding to keep their development worker post.

SSE) used by the growers.

In order that DCSG can continue to provide free activities for local people in the park they need to secure funding to pay the utilities needed to run the park. As well as the electricity and water used by the Douglas growers, DCSG also pay for the lighting supplying the MUGA and Play Park (EON).

Which City Plan / Local Community Plan Outcome(s) will it address?

City Plan – Dundee will be a greener city, made up of stronger communities where people feel empowered, safe, and proud to live.

Local Community Plan – We need quality green and open spaces that people can access in their own communities.

How many people will benefit from this project?

Will any specific groups benefit from this project? (male, female, age range or protected characteristic)

Over 35 local people have beds in the Growers area. Food is also provided to the Food larder. 200 – 300 young people use the MUGA and play park as do many local people.

Please say why the project is needed (please limit your answer to 500 words or less)

DCSG have worked to make Douglas Community Park a place which is used by children, young people and adults. They have also provided a secure water supply and electricity supply to the community growing area, MUGA and Play Park ensuring sustainability. However, DCSG are reliant on funding support so they can continue to develop. A grant for the utility costs will ensure a sustainable provision of electricity and water.

DCSG are on fixed tariffs for the electricity and monitor these on an annual basis to ensure they get the best price available.

Douglas growers need water and electricity. DCSG spent approx. 18months working with DCC and other partners to supply water & electricity. Consultation took place whilst the MUGA was being constructed. If the electricity supply had not been installed the park would not be accessible during the winter months.

The park provides a safe, high quality green space for everyone in Douglas.

Douglas is one of Dundee's housing areas built in the 1950's. The most recent census and SIMD figures are: -

Population 6939; Children 21%; Working 62%; Pensioners 17%. 82% of children are living in the 15% most deprived data zones. A third of data zones are ranked in the top 5% (most deprived). Over 40% of pensioners claim pension credit.

NOTE TO EXPLAIN REQUEST

Attached are the bills and bank statements DCSG receive showing utility costs. The water supply was only connected early in 2025 so a regular pattern of usage is not available. EON bills monthly as shown above. SSE usually bills quarterly but not always. DCSG request 3.5 months of grant aid – mid December 25 – end March 26. Costs for electricity over the winter are likely to increase. Standing charge costs are daily and shown on the bills. Also attached are the last accounts to end of March 2025. Please note the majority of the carry forward is ring fenced for salaries. DCSG hope to receive news of an Awards for All application by end Oct 25.
