Who are ScrapAntics?

ScrapAntics are a community organisation with 4 core impacts:

Recycling, Community, Education and Art.

We are here for the whole community but prioritise working with local people who face challenges through disadvantage.

We run Dundee's only ScrapStore as well as many play sessions, creative workshops, community drops ins, activities, and large scale events. We support a team of volunteers, offer affordable art studios and work a lot with the refugee and asylum seeker community.

We have now diverted **over 100 tonnes of business excess waste back** into the community as resources for creative and play-based projects.





What would we do with the funding?

We would like to employ a Resilience Worker for one year.

Their role would be to connect with **the most vulnerable in our community** and support them by;

- Providing them with essential resources and items including food, bedding, clothes, cleaning supplies and toiletries
- 2. Offering accessible advice and education on climate action
- 3. Exploring **tangible changes** people can make to emphasise sustainability in day-to-day life



How would the Resilience Worker do this?

- 1. **Engaging** with our community through existing drop in or play sessions, art workshops, events and activities
- 2. **Supporting** longer term relationship building and the ability to follow up with individuals or families making lifestyle changes
- 3. **Initiating conversations** around climate topics and encouraging them to enact change in their lives
- 4. Signposting to agencies addressing financial, food or fuel poverty is most needed
- 5. **Distributing** corporate donations of essential household items to people who are in desperate need (something we do not currently have the capacity for)



Who will benefit from this?

Those we work with in our Wellgate space who are often unemployed, from an asylum seeker or refugee background, have mental or physical health issues or suffer from isolation.

How much funding are we applying for?

We are asking for £19,333.51

Resilience Worker's wage: £14,311.75

7 hours per day x 3 days per week @ £12 per hour for one year (including the legal NI and pension contributions)

Associated costs: £5021.76

In-direct costs (travel, resources, printing, materials etc)
Top up resources for food parcels / starter packs, packaging, food bags etc
Management costs (for support, supervision, recruitment, admin etc)
