Dundee Ducks operate the multi-use sport pad at Unit 8, Manhattan Works. While it can be used for different sports, the surface is specially designed for roller skating and roller sports like roller hockey.

Each Saturday morning, we have a public skating session where people can come and skate in a safe and managed environment. We charge £1 per person for skaters/ spectators and £1 for skate hire, and attract up to 300 skaters per session.

Lots of people ask us if there are any evening sessions during the week, but the costs of running "new" sessions would be prohibitive for the charity in the event that we didn't attract the numbers we need to cover rink hire costs, heat and light, volunteer expenses etc.

We would like to offer up to 3 sessions (depending on the availability of funding) on selected Thursdays evenings between January and March 2026, which were free for people to participate. Almost all of our skaters on a Saturday morning are

children and young people, and their families and we expect that this would also be the same on Thursdays. We are assuming that 100 will attend each Thursday evening session.

We have applied for £900, equivalent to £300 for each of the 3 sessions we are proposing. If there was less funding available, we would be able to run 1 or 2 sessions (£300/600) instead.

The £300 per session would cover entry fees for 100 people (£100), skate hire for 100 people (£100) and volunteer expenses of £100 to cover costs for up to eight volunteers (four to steward on the pad and four to supervise the event, including trained first aiders).

### Which City Plan / Local Community Plan Outcome(s) will it address?

Within the Locality Community Plan for Ward 5 Maryfield 2022-27:

 We believe that these activities will improve life chances for children and families by improving health and wellbeing though physical activity, sport and leisure and creating opportunities for individuals, families and communities to connect.

### How many people will benefit from this project?

300

Per session – 67 children and young people and 33 adults per session

For all three events – 201 children and young people and 99 adults/parents/carers

#### Please say why the project is needed (please limit your answer to 500 words or less)

Opportunities for physical activity are limited during the winter due to lack of daylight and weather conditions. Having indoor opportunities which are affordable or free of charge are rare, and becoming rarer as community organisations in Maryfield and across the city struggle with increasing costs to run facilities and activities.

Roller skating is fun, and people don't need any special equipment apart from a set of skates (which Dundee Ducks have available to hire). We have kids skates for tots to teens, and all ages are able to join in (our biggest skates are an adult size 12).

The club runs a Santa's Grotto in December and we know that the period after Christmas can be quite "flat" - we believe that our free skating sessions will provide a reason for children and young people to get out of the house during cold dark evenings in January, February and/or March.

Roller sports are a niche sport and many members of the community will not realise the opportunities available locally. During the skating sessions, we will make sure that opportunities for roller hockey, roller derby and artistic roller skating (like figure skating but on wheels) are promoted and advertised. We are aiming to have up to 20% of the participants in these Thursday evening sessions following up with further public skating sessions or other roller sports.
