The grant is being requested to support a new youth group which has been developed to address an identified need within the Northeast ward of the city. The grant will provide first aid training, and some games and arts equipment for the young people.

The specific groups benefitting from this project will be young people with additional support needs therefore the protected characteristic of disability.

#### Please say why the project is needed (please limit your answer to 500 words or less)

The project is needed as young people with additional support needs find it too difficult to attend the mainstream youth provision for a variety of reasons such as it is too busy or too noisy. A group of parents have come together alongside the community empowerment and health teams to create the group as they have struggled to find suitable provision for their own young people.

A survey was sent out and responses received highlighted there is a need in the area for a suitable safe provision for young people who have additional support needs.

Through developing a youth group for ASN young people we are investing in their future through the provision of opportunities, inclusion and their long-term wellbeing as the group will provide a safe and supportive environment for the young people to develop social skills, life skills and their confidence which are all opportunities they may not access normally. The project will remove the barriers to participation for this group; it will promote equality and will empower the young people to contribute to their communities ultimately.  It is hoped that the impact will extend further than the weekly sessions with young people developing resilience, independence and hopefully more positive mental wellbeing while the impact on their families will be reassuring that their children are valued, supported and understood.
