The City Development Department is currently undertaking work to improve the appearance of the vacant ground between Bank Street and Aimer Square, Lochee. This work is being undertaken in a series of phases.

During consultation for the work, representatives from the Lochee Resident's and Tenants Association / Love Lochee expressed an interest in having a "Lochee Crest" included in the design. This crest was designed by children working within local community groups. The funding being sought will allow for the inclusion of an etched slab placed into the footway of the work.

Improve Quality Of Neighbourhoods

How many people will benefit from this project?

This is a public area so technically benefits everyone in the area due to improvement of the site. The etching of the crest will be of particular relevance to the local children and Love Lochee/Lochee Residents and Tennant's Association

Please say why the project is needed (please limit your answer to 500 words or less)

The addition of landscaping at Boots corner is seeking to return some of the civic pride that has been lost from the area because of the derelict sites. The vacant areas drag the impressions of Lochee down and redeveloping these areas will help bring positivity to the area

The funds available to the project at this time only cover the minimum essential construction work and has no capacity to include additional elements such as the crest which is important to giving local children ownership of the space.

The current phases of work removes an area of derelict ground from the High Street and:

- (b) replaces this with a seating area and planting to enhance the appearance of the street (current phase under construction now)
- (b) forms a large drainage facility which will help reduce the difficulties with the development of other derelict sites in Lochee (Former Church at Bright Street and St Ann Lane). Once the drainage constraint is resolved then this makes both sites available for new housing (this phase is scheduled to start soon)

The grant will assist in a new phase of the larger project providing added benefits to lochee by including the crest artwork and completion of the project.

create ownership of the spaces and make them less prone to vandalism.
