Over the past year within CLD Youth Work we have found our numbers are continually increasing week in, this is great to see but it may be due to the cost-of-living crisis, Young People gravitating to places that are safe, warm and offer activities and food at no cost to them.

Dundee has a population of 147,720 with 16% of that being those under 16 (23,704) In Dundee, 36.6% (54,497) of the population live within the data-zones ranked in the 20% most deprived in Scotland. This includes 43.8% (10,506) of children in Dundee. The Scottish Index of Multiple Deprivation (SIMD) is the official tool for identifying the most deprived areas in Scotland. "Deprived" does not just mean "poor" or "low income". It can also mean people have fewer resources and opportunities, for example in health and education.

Therefore, taken all this into consideration and being aware of the needs of local Young People through consistent consultation and asking what the issues are and needs for YP the grant will be used to provide a wide variety of Youth Work activities and opportunities available across the North East area. It will predominately be utilised to allow YP to access provision in the Holiday periods and to support the diversion of Anti-Social Behaviour within the NE Fintry ward area all whilst tackling food inequality and providing hot cooked meals to the YP who are accessing our evening groups. In addition, it is also allowing invaluable skills to be learnt from the Young Volunteers who are doing the cooking supervised to build on Skills for IIfe learning and work.

We will utilise the grant to provide a hot cooked meal twice a week at both the P7 Drop In Monday Night to 40-50 P7 across the North East Ward predominantly Fintry Primary but we also have YP from Mill O Mains and Whitfield area. Thursday Night S1+ Drop In where we recently had 80 YP attend who all attend both Braeview Academy, St Pauls' and a small group who have just started part time from School at D&A College.

Purchase items to allow the YP to take part in activities and attend outdoor activities in the holiday periods which would not be accessible due to the cost-of-living crisis and low income effecting the families of the YP we are working with.

#### How many people will benefit from this project?

The Young People will range from ages 11-19 as we also have Young Volunteers supporting our delivery, we also have Young People who fall under protected characteristics. We have a group of YP who identify as they them and are also transitioning from Male to Female and Female to Male who we are supporting. The Young People who will benefit will be the 130 YP who are accessing our evening provision as well as those who also receive 1-2-1 support but for a variety of reasons can't access evening provision. We would never not include all YP within the NE area to access provision.

Therefore, it would be 150 YP in total accessing provision.

#### Please say why the project is needed (please limit your answer to 500 words or less)

In the North East of Dundee, 36% of children are living in poverty after housing costs compared to the Dundee City figure of 31% (Child Poverty Action Group 2019). Within the North East the Fintry Area there are 21.6% are living in top 5% most Deprived and 34.75% are within the top 20% this is related to the figure of 1405 young people estimated to live in the area.

Therefore, the opportunities in which we provide as a youth team addresses inequalities such as food poverty, period poverty and the attainment gap. The grant will also enable young people to access activities and holiday activities that they financially would not be able to do. Child poverty rates for the North End Ward are 38.2% children living in poverty.

This is the local young people we want to target in our provision and may well already be working with as this is a high number of children and young people.

We want to offer healthy snacks and food opportunities such as learning how to cook from scratch and how to cook and live on a budget, so the Young People can take this knowledge back and replicate in their households. All whilst again as above building skills for life learning and work.

At all our evening provisions across the week food has been on offer and this has been thanks to the support of the funding. Young People come in and ask "What's for tea tonight" On Monday we had a new YP attend and the parent asked "Do they need money" I replied no we provide food its chicken fajita pasta tonight that the Young Volunteers made and she went "That's amazing as he just finished football and money is tight my husband has been diagnosed with terminal cancer and we our heating has broken, and we have no way to pay to get it fixed as its not insured" This is showing that if it wasn't for funding and providing a meal this YP may have not ate on Monday.

Our YP also don't always have activities to do during holiday periods again due to the cost of living, low income. The new School is about to open and there will be 8 weeks summer holidays. 8 weeks where families must find additional money to feed their children and YP every day. Therefore, this funding will help alleviate some of that worry.

As always, we speak to all YP attending provision and we also have our Young Volunteers take small groups and ask YP what they would like to see and do whilst at the Drop Ins and what things would they like to do during holiday periods.

We speak to all the P7's every Monday and also the S1+ YP asking them what they would like to do, lots come back and say they wouldn't be able to go or attend as it costs too much but when we tell them we apply for funding so there is no cost and no barrier to attendance for them they light up at the thought of new opportunities.

The funding application addresses a need identified by not just a CLD Youth Work team, but by valued local young people who are members of the local Community they have discussed with their younger peers to ask what they need. They are a group of YP wanting the best for themselves and others and wanting to ensure that YP have a future to look forward too and one that can be shaped by Young People for Young People and there Volunteering legacy can continue by supporting others through the same path they have been on. I hope the funding is supported by other groups as it is beneficial for YP. However, for now it is supported by Young People in the North East.

Youth Work provision is offered to all young people aged between 10-18 years who mainly reside in the Fintry, Mill O Mains and Whitfield areas of the North East of Dundee. Provision is free and accessible. Partnership working ensures that we are working with the most vulnerable young people identified in primary and secondary schools.

Providing free activities and hot warm meals is addressing poverty and addressing inequality by removing barriers to accessing services.
