**Please give a description of what you want this grant for - (please limit your answer to 500 words or less)**

We hope to be able to buy resources for our groups carried out across Coldside including Hilltown Community Centre, St Martins Church and feeder Primary Schools. We also have some groups and 1:1 work in Morgan Academy where a high proportion of pupils live in the Coldside area. These groups will cover diversionary work, skills development, transitional, personal and social development. Our groups aim to offer a safe inclusive space where young people can get together and build positive relationships.

In asking for these resources, we aim to support young people's skills development and confidence in using technology. In discussions with our young people, they agreed that using technology to be creative and design their own arts and crafts projects would enable them to not only use technology but enhance their creative and design skills working together to create unique pieces of craft/art.

The initial idea for this was looking at the new generation of young people and that they live in a technology focused society. But many of our young people due to issues of poverty may never have the opportunity to use technology like this.

The young we work with currently are part of Generation Alpha who were born in the years between 2010-2024. These are the children of the Millennials, many of them growing up during the Covid pandemic and have been using technology since birth.

We are entering a new generation of young people born in 2025 to 2039 call Generation Beta and it is predicted that this generation will be living in a world where Ai and Virtual, immersive are fully integrated into daily life.

A proportion of the young people we work with also come from families where English is not their first language. It is hoped that by using technology and arts and crafts it will help ease the language barrier to participation and suit different learning styles.

We are aware that some of the initial outlay for this equipment is expensive. Part of the groups using this equipment and materials have agreed that a proportion of the items made will be sold, hopefully at events like the Christmas and summer fayres at Hilltown Community Centres or the fayres in the school. It is hoped that this fundraising will be used to purchase more materials.

In asking for an embroidery machine, it is hoped that the young people will be able to customise clothes. And look at upcycling some of the things that they may have thrown away minimising wastage and supporting the reduce, reuse and recycle philosophy. Also, a lot of our young people do not have the finances to be able to buy a lot of trending outfits. It is hoped that this will allow them to use their imagination to create one-of-a-kind customizations, e.g., embroidering baseball caps and t shirts, personalising them, as well as making more traditional crafts.

We wanted the equipment to have a more grown-up feeling than some of the more traditional arts and crafts. We wanted the young people to be able to make and create practical items that they would be able to use every day, such as customising their own reusable cups/water bottle, Pencil case and bags etc. Supporting the idea of sustainability and reducing waste.

We also hope to allow the young people to make gifts that they could give to their family and friends etc. A lot of our young people do not have the means and resources to buy gifts for make them etc. A lot of our young people often get upset about this as they would like to give something back to the people that care for them.

We aim to allow our young people to opportunity in someway to be like their peer, for example a lot of them do not have a water bottle for school or a school bag. Although these will not replace designer bags but there is a trend out there for personalised and homemade items look more professionally done.

It is also hoped that once our young people become more confident in using these resources that they will become volunteer peer mentors and run smaller workshops to other young people potentially apart of our holiday provision. It is hoped this will give them a sense of ownership over their own group and a heightened sense of responsibility and giving back to others.

**Which City Plan / Local Community Plan Outcome(s) will it address?**

It will provide opportunities for young people to participate in inclusive, social and transitional activities in an area of recognised poverty (SIMD) for young people attending groups in Coldside by reducing some of the known barriers to participation for young people. Many of whom will be hit by the cost-of-living crisis, by making the activity available free to attend.

We will be using these resources with our diversionary, drop in, transition work with P7's and local friendship groups.

These will be 40 young people. However, these resources can also be shared with other groups to widen the number of participants.

We are aware that we have also submitted a recent bid for team building resources. These items we are asking for today have been on the young people's wish list but have never felt that there was an opportunity to buy these.

Although we will be using these resources with existing groups, we are aiming to introduce more technology focused resources in a bid to introduce something new rather than game-based tech, such as X Box and PlayStation which can often be single player games. We hope to make it a more collaborative and inclusive activities, that will challenge thinking and creative skills.

**What local consultation has taken place regarding this application?**

We have held discussions with our young people about how we introduce the use of technology that does not centre around using gaming devices or computers in the traditional way. They liked the idea of it being craft based as it could include everyone. They felt that when using gaming equipment and computers there was often a gender divide in what they liked to do.

This has been carried out by verbal group discussions with the group, mainly due to their learning and language barriers.
